1. SAMSSA Sanctioned matches

SAMSSA sanctioned matches will be run according to the latest approved and published IMSSU/SAMSSA rules.

The results of these championships (only) are used in combination with trials to select the Protea team members for international participation.

The following matches are currently sanctioned by SAMSSA:

Transvaal Classic Open Championship
Gauteng Open Championship
Krokodilspruit Classic Open Championship
Free State Open Championship
Free State Classic Open Championship
BMSSC Classic Open Championship
Steenbok Classic Open Championship
Eastern Province Open Championship
Eastern Province Classic Open Championship
Western Province Open Championship
Western Province Classic Open Championship
Atlantis Classic Open Championship
SA National Championship/Africa championship
Wolwehoek Classic Open Championship

Dates for the above championships are as decided at the SAMSSA AGM with the SA National Championships having first priority, all open provincial championships second priority and all classic championships last priority. To give competitors fair chance to compete in all these championships, dates may not overlap.

As per the decision taken at the 2009 AGM, all affiliated clubs are entitled to one SAMSSA sanctioned match per year. All competition dates of sanctioned matches are to be submitted to SAMSSA prior to the SAMSSA AGM for approval. This will ensure that competitions do not overlap.

SAMSSA sanctioned matches are advertised via the secretariat of the individual provinces (except for direct members) as well as the official SAMSSA website www.samssa.org.za. The members enter these matches via the secretary of each provincial body, who will forward the entries to the hosting body (i.e. Provincial secretary for provincial championship and SAMSSA for National championship). Entries for sanctioned matches hosted by clubs may be submitted directly to the hosting club.

The scores attained in any sanctioned match will only be recorded by SAMSSA if the shooter is a fully paid-up member of SAMSSA. The scores submitted for shooters who are not fully paid-up members will not be used toward accreditation for dedicated status.

SAMSSA may perform drug testing at any of the SAMSSA sanctioned matches. All drug testing will be performed in line with the requirements of SASCOC.

It is not required for an entrant to have a classification when entering for any of the SAMSSA sanctioned championships. The individual will be classified according the first score that he/she shot in a particular event. However, the shooter must be familiar with IMSSU and SAMSSA rules and general range safety practices. It is the obligation of the secretariat of each province (through whom the shooter enters a competition) to notify the hosting organization that the shooter is competent to participate in a SAMSSA sanctioned match.



2. **Important General Range Rules**

- 2.1. No Club, range officer or range owner can be held accountable for any accidents, except where negligence is proven.
- 2.2. The chief range officer is in total control of the range.
- 2.3. No firearm may be removed from its bag or case, except at the shooting point and with the permission of the chief range officer.
- 2.4. Keep all firearms on the firing line pointed down the range at all times.
- 2.5. The range officer is entitled to declare a firearm unsafe and to prohibit the use thereof.
- 2.6. Under no circumstances should a loaded firearm be transported to or from the range or shooting points.
- 2.7. When a range has been closed, nobody is allowed to go beyond the shooting line. A red flag or light should indicate that a range is closed.
- 2.8. When a range has been declared safe (i.e. open), nobody is allowed to handle any firearms under any circumstance. A green light or flag should indicate that the range is safe.
- 2.9. Any shooters under the age of 21 will only be allowed to shoot with the permission of the range officer and even then only under the direct supervision of a responsible senior, unless the shooter has been awarded competency by SAPS.
- 2.10. No ammunition that causes damage to the targets may be used. The range officer will have the right to prohibit the use of certain bullets, should they find that it causes damage to the targets (except in instances where the targets are not of the correct steel of thickness). The following general guidelines apply (but not limited to):
 - a. Centre fire rifles 6mm and up should preferably be used on Big Bore Targets at a minimum distance of 200m.
 - b. Supersonic .22 ammunition (stingers, blitzer etc.) is not allowed on the Small Bore Rifle or Handgun targets.
 - c. Only air rifle no.1 pellets may be used on air rifle targets.
- 2.11. The hosting organization will have the right to impose penalties on shooters who damage targets.
- 2.12. Shooters may never practice alone.
- 2.13. Shooters must behave at all times on the range. Foul language and/or insolent behaviour will not be tolerated.
- 2.14. Any complaints should be submitted in writing to a committee member or the range officer. The letter should indicate your name in block letters, be dated and signed.
- 2.15. Vehicles and possessions are brought to the range at own risk.
- 2.16. No alcohol or drugs may be consumed during practice or competition. If any such behaviour is noticed, it must be reported to the range officer, who must remove the shooter from the firing point.
- 2.17. No shooter may use the title Metallic Silhouette Shooting if he/she does not keep to the rules of the sport.
- 2.18. The firearm license holder must be present when other competitors are using his or her firearms to comply with firearms regulations.
- 2.19. When the rail/stand is wider and longer than the feet of the targets, then the position where the feet of the targets should be positioned must be clearly marked and set accordingly during target setting.



3. *Special rules for U20 competitors*

A: Junior u/9

It is the intention to introduce young shooters to the sport, aged six (6) to under 9 (year of 6th and 9th birthdays included).

The rules for their events are exactly the same as for the relevant IMSSU/SAMSSA event, except that the shooter uses a single long bag placed on a table such as being used for sighting in by hunters. Furthermore, due to the very young age of the shooters, it is extremely important from a safety perspective that the child is under direct adult supervision and guidance. It is a prerequisite that the child be deemed a “safe” shooter and the range officer will have the right to refuse the participation if such a child should pose a safety risk to other shooters.

A u/9 stand normally comprises of a table on which a single long shooting bag is placed. Safety is paramount and care should be taken that the rifle cannot “slip off” the rest when the competitor is not shooting. The stand used by u/14 competitors may also be used.

Please note that these events are, in the spirit of Metallic Silhouette Shooting, standing events and that the child will not be allowed to have any support other than the rifle resting on the rest. **Not any part of the body is allowed to come into contact with the rest or table/stand, inclusive of both hands.**

A child in this age group can enter as a u/14, but then only as an u/14. He or she cannot enter a specific competition as an u/14 for some events and as an u/9 in other events. It is allowed that a U/9 can participate as an u/14 in one competition and as an U/9 at the next. U/9 entrants are only eligible for the u/9 class Medals.

B: Junior u/14

It is the intention to introduce young shooters to the sport, aged under 10 to under 14 (year of 10th and 14th birthdays included).

The rules for these events are exactly the same as for the relevant IMSSU or SAMSSA event, except that the shooter uses the single rest as an aid in the rifle events. Furthermore, due to the very young age of the shooters, it is extremely important from a safety perspective that the child is under direct adult supervision and guidance. It is a prerequisite that the child be deemed a “safe” shooter and the range officer will have the right to refuse the participation if such a child should pose a safety risk to other shooters.

A u/14 stand normally comprises of a telescopic stand on which an 8cm wide support is mounted. The stand used must be such that the event can be shot standing. A maximum of 83mm may be in contact with the rifle. The support should be of such nature that it gives limited support the rifle on the sides. The normal hunting tripod is allowed provided that it does not give excessive support to the rifle. The maximum number of feet for the stand is 3 and may not exceed 1x1x1m at floor level. See below examples of typical allowable “hunting” stands:



Please note that the rifle events are, in the spirit of Metallic Silhouette Shooting, standing events and that the child will not be allowed to have any support other than the rifle resting on the rest. **Not any part of the body is allowed to come into contact with the rest or stand, inclusive of both hands. For the Sport Handgun**



events the stand may be used to support the hand(s). The shooter should not use the stand to support the barrel or frame.

A child in this age group can enter as an u/20, but then only as an u/20. An u/14 cannot enter a specific as a u/14 for some events and as an u/20 in other events. It is allowed that a U/14 can participate as an u/20 in one competition and as an U/14 at the next. U/14 entrants are only eligible for the u/14 Class Medals.

C: Junior u/20

It is the intention for shooters from under 15 to under 20 to participate in silhouette shooting, applying the same rules relevant to seniors participants (year of 15th and 20th birthdays included).

The rules for these events are exactly the same as for the relevant IMSSU or SAMSSA events. However, it is extremely important from a safety perspective that the competitor is under direct adult supervision, unless the competitor has obtained competency certificated from SAPS in which case the shooter may participated without adult supervision. It is a prerequisite that the competitor be deemed a “safe” shooter and the range officer will have the right to refuse the participation of such a competitor should he/she pose a safety risk to other shooters.

As per IMSSU decision at the 2016 General Assembly a u/20 can enter the competition as a u/20 for some events and as a Senior in other events. U/20 entrants are eligible for the u/20 Class Medals and Overall medals. U20 medals will be awarded as follows: the overall medals will be calculated first. Should the U20 score be good enough for overall medal, that U20 will receive an overall medal and the next best U20 score will receive Gold in the U20 class.

4. SAMSSA sanctioned events

An event will be deemed a sanctioned event if the details of such an event are included in the in-house rules. Any hosting organisation has the option to host other events, but those scores will not be kept by SAMSSA for record purposes. Should a general need arise to include a specific item to the sanctioned event list, such proposal (inclusive of a technical specification) must be done in writing and submitted to the SAMSSA secretariat. The SAMSSA secretariat will circulate the document to the SAMSSA Executive and the SAMSSA councillors for evaluation and authorisation. Once the specific item has been accepted, it will be included in the in-house rules, after which SAMSSA database will make provision for keeping relevant statistics as from the ensuing championship.

SAMSSA categorise shooters in age classes as follows:

Junior u/9	Any shooter that turns 6 until the year he/she turns 9	*
Junior u/14	any shooter that turns 10 until the year he/she turns 14	
Junior u/20	any shooter that turns 15 until the year he/she turns 20	
Senior	any shooter that turns 21 until the year he/she turns 54	
Veteran	any shooter that turns 55	
Silver	any shooter that is 65 years or a shooter who, for medical conditions, are no longer able to participate standing upright. The scores will not be eligible for overall or I, M, A, or B Class medals.	

Note: All shooters U/20 can only participate with the consent of the range officer and under the supervision of a responsible adult unless the competitor has been declared competent by SAPD.

The following are approved SAMSSA events (please note that only IMSSU events are compulsory to host at any SAMSSA sanctioned match):

* *Please note the items 15 & 16 are there to complete the 80-shot events that are current practice for Small Bore Rifle. The hosting organization has the option of including events 15 and 16 except for National Trials and National Championships where all four events will be competed in.*

* *When shooting with one rifle, the competitor must shoot in the order of 13, 15, 14 and then 16. This is to comply with IMSSU rules of shooting the same firearm in a higher class*

* *When a competitor uses 2 rifles – one for silhouette and another one for light – the competitor has the option of either starting with silhouette and then shooting light. However, should the competitor commence with silhouette, the competitor must complete silhouette first and shoot both events 14 and 16 before commencing with 13 and 15. In such a case the shooting order will be 14, 16, 13 and then 15.*

* *Under no circumstances may the competitor shoot the second try before the first try of either light or silhouette events. This implies that event 13 must be shot before event 15 and event 14 before event 16.*

* *In the case of the competitor only entering events 13 and 14, the competitor must shoot in the order 13 and then 14, unless the competitor uses 2 different rifles, then 14 may be shot before 13*

A team will generally consist of 3 competitors.

Special rules for SAMSSA Junior Air Pistol and Air Rifle Challenge

A SASSF grant in 2011 has made it possible for SAMSSA to acquire Air Pistols and Air Rifles which is made available to affiliated provinces for junior development. The Junior Air Pistol and Air Rifle Challenge are therefore introduced at the SA Nationals for provincial development teams to compete against each other.

The two best scores in each event will be totalled. This arrangement allows a competitor to specialize in any one of the events. The team with the highest score will be the winner. Provincial Associations are encouraged to consider development colours for these teams and also to invite development teams to compete in similar competitions at their respective open championships.

8. SAMSSA Sanctioned Match event results – Verification and acceptance procedures

The following administrative rules will be applied for all scores recorded at SAMSSA sanctioned matches:

- 8.1. The final individual event results will be published after completion of the championships and announced that it is available for verification.
- 8.2. Competitors will have one hour after the announcement is made to verify their individual event scores, classification and age group division. Any inconsistencies need to be reported by way of a written note to the match director, announcer or championship statistician. After the hour allowed for verification has expired, all unquestioned individual event scores, classification and age group divisions will be accepted as final.
- 8.3. Where not dependant on the information in the aforementioned paragraph, derived results (e.g. shoot-off results, aggregates, team results, victor ludorum results, etc.) may be queried up to half an hour before the advertised starting time of the prize-giving, after which it is accepted as final.
- 8.4. SAMSSA supplies the hosting organisation with a database to run the competition and it includes the paid up status of the SAMSSA members. Should the paid up status of a member be contested, a copy of the proof of payment must accompany the submitted competition results. Only scores of members paid up during the competition will be recorded in the SAMSSA database. Scores of members submitting membership payment after the last day of the competition will not be accepted.
- 8.5. For members joining during or just before the competition and a SAMSSA membership number was not issued in time for the competition, copies of the application for membership and proof of payment must accompany the results when submitted. SAMSSA will also not accept scores for which the identity number, or alternatively the date of birth and gender, of a competitor is not known.

This event will be a standing (as defined in IMSSU rules) event. The rifle will conform to the following rules:

- Any Semi-Auto Big Bore Rifle with cartridge using 6mm (.243) or larger can be used, with the proviso that loads do not damage the targets.
- Any open or aperture sights will be allowed.
- Optical devices will be allowed.
- Any safe trigger will be allowed.
- Silencers (moderators/compensators) are allowed
- Muzzle breaks are strictly forbidden

- The following calibres are allowed: .22 Magnum, .22 Hornet, .222 Remington, .223 Remington, .357 Magnum and .44 Magnum, with the proviso that loads do not damage the targets.
- Calibres that are excluded: .220 Swift, .22-250 Remington and .25-06 Remington, due to target damage.
- Any safe trigger will be allowed.
- Silencers (moderators/compensators) are allowed
- Muzzle breaks are strictly forbidden

- Any open or aperture sights will be allowed.
- Optical devices will be allowed.
- IMSSU rules for palm rests, buttplates, cheekpieces, compensators, muzzle breaks and general equipment, applies.
- Any safe trigger will be allowed.
- 1/10th IMSSU sized targets to be used
- Silencers (moderators/compensators) are allowed
- Muzzle breaks are strictly forbidden

Event 55: Black Powder Rifle Open Sights

General

This event will be a standing (as defined in IMSSU rules) event. The rifle will conform to the following rules:

- The intent of this event is to allow a common black powder rifle built by major black powder rifle manufacturers and that is, or was, readily available to the general public over the counter. It is the competitor's responsibility to provide any documentation which may be required to establish conformance of a rifle to the rules. Custom made rifles are prohibited.
- Any Black Powder Rifle calibre can be used, with the proviso that loads do not damage the targets.
- No Black Powder cartridge rifles will be allowed
- Any open or aperture sights will be allowed.
- No optical devices will be allowed.
- Any safe trigger will be allowed.
- Ignition by percussion cap or flint only

The IMSSU defined Big Bore Handgun targets will be used. The targets will be set at the following distances:

Firing Period

Five shots will be allowed in two sets of 2½ minute periods.

Five sighter shots will be allowed to be shot during two rifle sighter periods - two or three shots per normal rifle sighter period. Capping will be allowed before sighter shots. (A specific command will be given to allow for the firing of a cap)

Event 56: Black Powder Rifle Any Sights

General

This event will be a standing (as defined in IMSSU rules) event. The rifle will conform to the following rules:

- In addition to rifles allowed in the Black Powder Rifle event, custom made rifles are also allowed.
- Any Black Powder Rifle calibre can be used, with the proviso that loads do not damage the targets.
- No Black Powder cartridge rifles will be allowed
- Any open, aperture or optical sights will be allowed.
- Any safe trigger will be allowed.
- Any type of ignition allowed, including electronic ignition

Targets

The IMSSU defined Big Bore Handgun targets will be used. The targets will be set at the following distances:

Chickens	-	50 meters
Pigs	-	100 meters
Turkeys	-	150 meters

Firing Period

Five shots will be allowed in two sets of 2½ minute periods.

The course of fire will consist of 20 shots, 2 shots in the first firing period of 2 min 30 s and 3 shots during the second firing period of 2 min 30 s, or vice versa.

Sighters

Five sighter shots will be allowed to be shot during two rifle sighter periods - two or three shots per normal rifle sighter period. Capping will be allowed before sighter shots. (A specific command will be given to allow for the firing of a cap)

Appendix A

SAMSSA criteria for awarding colours and selecting a National team



Preamble

The South African Sports Confederation and Olympic Committee (SASCOC) is the body that regulates the award of National Colours through its established National Colours Commission. The SAMSSA National Team selection criteria must conform to these regulations for SAMSSA to apply for National Colours. Since the SASCOC regulations require international participation as determined by the technical rules and regulations of SAMSSA and its international controlling body, selection criteria is also required to take the IMSSU rules into account.

Objective

The purpose of the National Teams is not only to bring home medals, but the team members are also ambassadors of the country as well as for the sport. Metallic Silhouette Shooting is as much a team sport as it is an individual effort and this must be taken into consideration with the selection of a team. The main consideration should be on the performance of the candidates with the focus on the performance at the time of team selection. The behaviour and loyalty to the sport should not be discarded, especially in the case of candidates with comparative scores.

Definitions

- **National team** - This is the team that will be awarded National Colours. This team consists of individuals competing in the team aggregates, individual aggregates or individual events. The team members may participate in official national colours, subject to SASCOC approval.
- **National Selection Panel** - The committee responsible for selecting the National Team(s) to represent South Africa at an International Competition. The panel will be constituted in accordance with Clause 16.2 of the SAMSSA constitution.
- **National Trials** - All the candidates who qualify according to these selection criteria will be invited to the national trials to be eligible to be selected to represent South Africa in an international competition. The candidates at the trials may be competing for either National or Federation colours.
- **Federation Colours** - Federation colours may be awarded subject to SASSF approval to qualifying candidates competing in an international competition.
- **Association Colours** - Association colours may be awarded to veteran (master), ladies, junior or physical disability sides, development individuals or teams competing against other countries in friendly, invitation or test matches amongst others. The National Selection panel will consider applications for the awarding of Association Colours by default based on the development breakpoints in the current criteria. For special considerations not provided for in this criteria (e.g. physical disability requirements, team managers when/where applicable, etc.) the National Selection panel may prescribe criteria applicable to a particular match, but published in advance to afford members at least twice the opportunity to compete for the colours awards. Association Colours may also be awarded for honorary or long service, but the decision for these awards must be motivated and presented at council meetings for approval.



- **Sanctioned Event** - A basic sanctioned event will consist of a 40 round course of fire with an equal number of targets being set at each distance. Multiple 40 round events fired straight through shall be converted to a 40 round match equivalent and treated as a single sanctioned event. Conversion to a 40 round equivalent event shall be calculated by dividing the score by the number of multiples and retaining fractions to decide ranking.
- **Aggregate** - The combined scores of all sanctioned events in a category, as defined by the IMSSU rules. (Section VI - Clause J of "General technical Rules for all Metallic Silhouette Discipline Shooting Categories" - IMSSU Official Sporting Rules, latest revision)
- **Breakpoint** - The minimum score achieved at one or more sanctioned match(es) as part of the process to qualify for trials.
- **National ranking list** - Competitor ranking for each aggregate or event based on the scores shot at SAMSSA/IMSSU sanctioned championships.
- **Selection ranking list** - Competitor ranking compiled from the National ranking list and the scores achieved at the National Trials.
- **SAMSSA/IMSSU sanctioned championship** - A Club, Provincial, National or International championship which is approved by SAMSSA and shot to the IMSSU rules where breakpoints can be achieved. The scores of these competitions will also be used for the National Ranking as well as for inclusion in a National Team. All the SAMSSA members should have the opportunity to compete in these competitions as a member of a team or as an individual. SAMSSA members may, upon furnishing official results of their personal participation, apply to submit their scores of IMSSU sanctioned championships hosted outside the borders of South Africa. This application must be lodged within one month after the competition, but not later than 7 days before the subsequent trials.
- **SAMSSA** - The national controlling body - South African Metallic Silhouette Shooting Association
- **IMSSU** - The international controlling body - International Metallic Silhouette Shooting Union
- **SASSCo** - The national federation representing all sport shooting associations - South African Shooting Sport Confederation
- **SASCOC** - The body that controls the awarding of National Colours - South African Sports Confederation and Olympic Committee

Breakpoint and Ranking criteria

1. As per definition, an aggregate consists of multiple events. Therefore, if a participant does not compete in all the required events of any aggregate, the aggregate score of these events cannot count towards any aggregate breakpoint.
2. The total of an aggregate will be calculated from the sum of the basic sanctioned events it consists of (for example Big Bore Handgun Aggregate consists of the scores of the relevant 4 events of revolver, production, standing and unlimited). By default, the aggregate breakpoint will be calculated simply by adding the scores representing the basic sanctioned events of the aggregate.
3. In the event of any aggregate in a sanctioned match where the individual event totals are also offered in multiples of 40, the following will apply in this selection criteria:



- a. The first 40-shots of each event will be used to calculate the relevant breakpoint.
- b. In the case where the score achieved in the first 40 shots of the said event cannot be distinguished from the $n \times 40$ -shots score, the score will be converted to a 40-shot score by dividing it "n".

4. The following table summarizes the qualifying breakpoints for the aggregate events:

6. The competitors will be ranked for each aggregate or event based on the following:



- a. The best 2 aggregate or sum of best 3 individual event scores shot at SAMSSA/IMSSU sanctioned championships in the period from after the last National Trials for the selection of the National Team to participate in the World Championship up to but not including the National Trials before the next World Championship. This will not include scores of any National Trials except where the previous trials were hosted in conjunction with another SAMSSA/IMSSU sanctioned championships
 - b. If a National Team is to be selected for any other International Championship, excluding the World Championship, the best 2 aggregates or sum of best 3 events shot at SAMSSA/IMSSU sanctioned championships during the preceding 24 months will be considered for breakpoints. This will not include scores of any National Trials except where the previous trials were hosted in conjunction with another SAMSSA/IMSSU sanctioned championship.
7. The SAMSSA Statistics Officer will rank members according to the above and this National ranking list will be updated and published on the SAMSSA web site within one month after each SAMSSA/IMSSU sanctioned Club, Provincial, National and International Championship. Junior members to be ranked separately as well as included in the senior ranking.

National Trials

1. The National Trials will be the same format as a SAMSSA/IMSSU sanctioned championship and may be part of a SAMSSA/IMSSU sanctioned championship. Where the National Trials is part of a SAMSSA/IMSSU sanctioned championship, the scores at this sanctioned championship will also be considered for breakpoints for inclusion in the next National Trials.
2. The member should be actively participating in SAMSSA/IMSSU sanctioned competitions and therefore have a ranking as per the National ranking list required by these criteria.
3. A member will only be considered once he/she has stated his/her intention to enter for the specific International Championship by accepting the invitation and participation in the National Trials.
4. The member should be a member in Good Standing.
5. All the candidates achieving or exceeding the qualifying criteria of
 - a. two national breakpoints per aggregate, and/or
 - b. one event breakpoint (sum total of 3 best scores in that event)qualify by default and will be invited to participate in the National Trials. If there are less than 3 qualifying candidates that entered for the trials for the relevant national aggregate, the candidates will only be selected to participate as individual aggregate specialists and SAMSSA will not enter a "team" for the aggregate team competition.
6. Candidates achieving or exceeding the qualifying criteria of two development breakpoints or two junior development breakpoints may be invited to participate in the National Trials. Invitations may be limited to only the aggregate categories for which there are no qualifying national aggregate breakpoint candidates.



7. All aggregate teams will consist of no less than three members. Different colours (e.g. national/federation/association) may not be mixed within aggregate teams.
8. Invited candidates that do not participate in the trials where there are more than three candidates for an aggregate category, will not be considered for any colour awards. The only exception is sickness that requires hospitalization of the candidate or death of near family (spouse, children or parents). It will be at the discretion of the National Selection Panel to include such a candidate. The average of the aggregate and/or event scores of the last 2 competitions will count towards trials scores for the relevant individual, but these two scores should have been achieved in the 6 months prior to the trials to ensure that a current performance level is considered.

Selection criteria

1. A selection ranking list will be compiled by adding together:
 - a. the averages of the two best aggregate scores and/or average of three best event scores from the invited candidates on the national ranking list
 - b. plus the associated scores from the trials shot over two aggregates and/or the two associated trial scores for the qualifying individual events.
2. Where there are three or less candidates that accepted the invitation to the National Trials for any aggregate category, the selection ranking list for that aggregate category will be compiled taking only the averages of the two best aggregate scores from the national ranking list plus the associated scores from the trials shot over one aggregate and/or one associated trial scores for the qualifying individual events. These candidates are therefore required to take part in the second leg of the trials. The selection of the aggregate team or aggregate specialist(s) proceeds with the changed selection ranking list and these candidates are therefore not required to take part in the trials.
3. A National Team is selected from the candidates on the selection ranking list that achieved the qualifying national breakpoints. The top 3 aggregate competitors are selected first from the selection ranking list for the aggregate teams. A fourth member may be selected per aggregate as a reserve at the discretion of the selection panel. If there are less than 3 aggregate candidates, the available candidates will be selected as aggregate specialists. Next the top event specialists are selected and this may be more than one specialist per event at the discretion of the selection panel. An aggregate specialist can be selected as event specialist in another discipline however National Colours will only be awarded once.
4. If there are aggregate categories where there are no candidates available to select for the national team, invited candidates that has achieved the development breakpoint will be selected and awarded Federation colours to compete as teams or individuals in those categories.

Administrative procedures

1. The National Selection panel will be appointed 3 months prior to the trials. The names of the selection panel shall be distributed to all SAMSSA members.



2. The National Team that will participate at the International Championship will be selected not less than four months prior to the International Championship to allow for SASCOC approval and acquiring of clothing and apparel.
3. The Team Manager will be appointed by the SAMSSA Executive Committee whilst the team members will select the Team Captains for each of the Handgun and Rifle shooting categories. Application for team manager should be by a deserving candidate and knowledge of coaching and/or sport management would be a recommendation.
4. Changes to the selection criteria may only be made at a Special General Meeting scheduled to take place during the National Trials and will be used towards the selection of candidates for the next trials. Should IMSSU rule changes impact the selection of the National Team in between trials, the councillors may call a Special General Meeting to change only the selection criteria where such rule changes impact the selection criteria.

Appendix B

SAMSSA criteria for awarding and retention of Dedicated Status



Preamble

SAMSSA (Accreditation certificate number 1300025) invites its members to apply to be declared a "DEDICATED SPORTSPERSON" in accordance with the stipulations of Article 16 of Act 60 of 2000. This dedicated status will provide members the rights as per the regulations, for example: To apply for more than four firearm licenses, to apply to possess more than 200 rounds of ammunition per license and will also empower a dedicated sports person, that is not of age yet, to apply for a firearm licence and/or to apply for co-licensing of a firearm.

Qualifying Criteria

In order to qualify as "Dedicated Sportsperson", the member must comply with the following criteria: The member **MUST**:

- Apply per the prescribed SAMSSA Application Form to be declared a Dedicated Sportsperson
NB! Reflect and supply all relevant experience and training/qualifications and documentary proof of such
- AND
- must be a fully paid up affiliated member of SAMSSA
- AND
- must be Classified on the SAMSSA database (must have competed in at least one SAMSSA Sanctioned Match in the preceding 12 months)
- AND
- must have a National Ranking at SAMSSA
- AND
- must have successfully completed the SAMSSA RO examination
- AND
- must have participated in the league shoots of a SAMSSA affiliated Club (in the preceding 12 months)

Criteria to retain Dedicated Status

In order for a member to retain his/her "Dedicated Sportsperson" status, the member must comply with the following criteria:

- must be a fully paid up affiliated member of SAMSSA
- AND
- must be a member in good standing
- AND
- A member should have participated in one sanctioned match in 24 month period (i.e. be on the ranking tables) or a member should have participated in 2 league events in the preceding 12 month period

Provinces must submit a report on the member activity of all their dedicated sports person members together with their membership fees not later than 31 December each year. Where applicable, reasons must be furnished for members that did not meet the required activity criteria.

- 20-shot matches for non-IMSSU events: This will be allowed. The hosting province can decide (and clearly state so on their entry forms) to host the non IMSSU events (excluding items 20 and 21) as 20-shot events. The second set of 5 animals will just have a 0 score in the SAMSSA db.
- Semi-Auto rifle events changed to Semi-Auto rifle Any Sights events.
- Participation of Visitors: Only SAMSSA members may participate in a SAMSSA sanctioned match.
- Trials 3 team members qualify: In those aggregates where only 3 members have qualified, they will only be required to participate in the second leg of the trials.

7 October 2016

- The Small Bore Rifle Open Sights events 47 and 48 to be changed to Freestyle events.

4 October 2017

- Varmint Handgun barrel length to be the same as BBHG Unlimited (15 inches).

1 March 2018 (Special General Meeting at Trials)

- Typical hunting tripod with V-shaped head will be allowed to be used as stand for U14, U09 and Silver Class participants. The space that the feet of the tripod consumes may not be larger than 1x1x1m. No part of the tripod may extend beyond the shooting point of the competitor.
- Added: U20 medals will be awarded as follows: the overall medals will be calculated first. Should the u20 score be good enough for overall medal, that U20 will receive an overall medal and the next best U20 score will receive Gold in the U20 class.
- Added rules governing shooting order of events Small Bore Rifle (Scoped events)

** Please note the items 15 & 16 are there to complete the 80-shot events that are current practice for Small Bore Rifle. The hosting organization has the option of including events 15 and 16 except for National Trials and National Championships where all four events will be competed in.*

** When shooting with one rifle, the competitor must shoot in the order of 13, 15, 14 and then 16. This is to comply with IMSSU rules of shooting the same firearm in a higher class*

** When a competitor uses 2 rifles – one for silhouette and another one for light – the competitor has the option of either starting with silhouette and then shooting light. However, should the competitor commence with silhouette, the competitor must complete silhouette first and shoot both events 14 and 16 before commencing with 13 and 15. In such a case the shooting order will be 14, 16, 13 and then 15.*

** Under no circumstances may the competitor shoot the second try before the first try of either light of silhouette events. This implies that event 13 must be shot before event 15 and event 14 before event 16.*

** In the case of the competitor only entering events 13 and 14, the competitor must shoot in the order 13 and then 14, unless the competitor uses 2 different rifles, then 14 may be shot before 13*

- Added: When the rail/stand is wider and longer than the feet of the targets, then the position where the feet of the targets should be positioned must be clearly marked and set accordingly during target setting
- Added that not all events or aggregates has to be hosted at SAMSSA sanctioned matches

Breakpoint and Ranking criteria

1. As per definition, an aggregate consists of a number of sanctioned events. Therefore if a participant does not compete in all the required events of any aggregate, the aggregate score of these events cannot count towards any aggregate breakpoint.
2. The total of an aggregate will be calculated from the sum of the number of basic sanctioned events it consists of, i.e. number of events in the aggregate multiplied by 40.
3. In the event of any aggregate in a sanctioned match where the individual event totals are also offered in multiples of 40, the following will apply in this selection criteria:
 - a. All the events in the aggregate must be offered in the same multiple of 40. Only exception is for aggregates where big bore and small bore calibres are mixed for

which events with multiple 40 shot events will be converted to 40 shot equivalents before calculating the aggregate;

- b. All multiple 40 shot events must individually be competed in its entirety before another event in that aggregate is competed in;
- c. By default, the aggregate breakpoint will be calculated simply by adding the scores representing the basic sanctioned events of the aggregate;
- d. Where the breakpoint calculation finds that a competitor has competed in a multiple 40 shot event, it will override the basic sanctioned event breakpoint calculation and calculate the breakpoint by adding the converted equivalent scores of all of the individual events.

Breakpoint and Ranking criteria

1. As per definition, an aggregate consists of multiple events. Therefore, if a participant does not compete in all the required events of any aggregate, the aggregate score of these events cannot count towards any aggregate breakpoint.
2. The total of an aggregate will be calculated from the sum of the basic sanctioned events it consists of (for example Big Bore Handgun Aggregate consists of the scores of the relevant 4 events of revolver, production, standing and unlimited). By default, the aggregate breakpoint will be calculated simply by adding the scores representing the basic sanctioned events of the aggregate.
3. In the event of any aggregate in a sanctioned match where the individual event totals are also offered in multiples of 40, the following will apply in this selection criteria:
 - a. The first 40-shots of each event will be used to calculate the relevant breakpoint.
 - b. In the case where the score achieved in the first 40 shots of the said event cannot be distinguished from the n x 40-shots score, the score will be converted to a 40-shot score by dividing it "n".
